

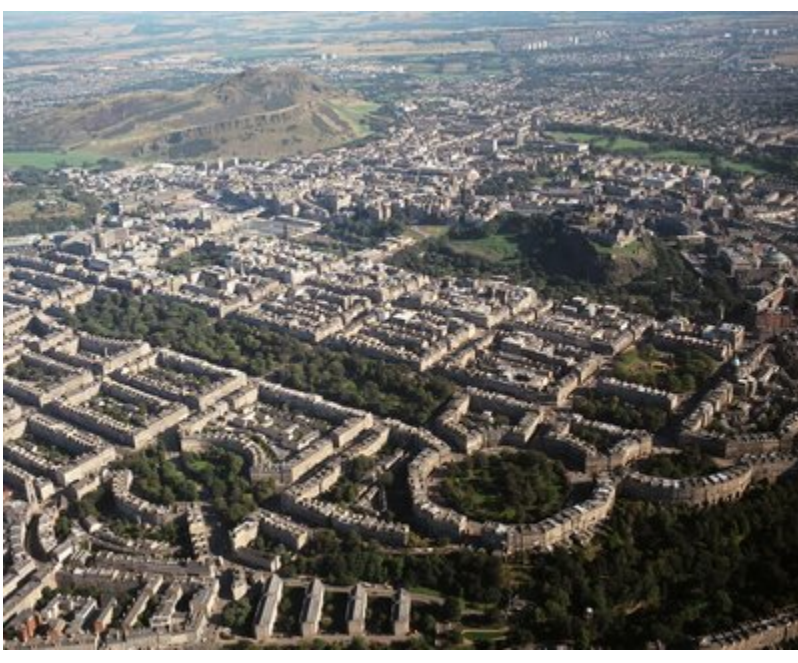

Edinburgh World Heritage asks residents to help shape conservation priorities

Edinburgh World Heritage has issued a call to residents to share their suggestions for where future conservation work in the city should be focused. As part of wider efforts in the city to build back better, post-COVID-19, the charity is asking local people to help identify neighbourhoods and individual buildings in or near the World Heritage Site that need attention. Funding for the work will come from Edinburgh World Heritage's Conservation Funding Programme which has been designed to enhance and protect the city's World Heritage Site. The programme is supported by Historic Environment Scotland and has been highlighted by the Atlas.WH project as an example of best practice.
