Operation D of the Morro da Sé neighbourhood

Work continues on joint rehabilitation of five buildings in CHP PM that are integrated within Operation D of the Morro da Sé neighbourhood, located at the meeting point between the Rua de Santana, the Rua da Bainharia and the Rua dos Mercadores. The work in progress, that was awarded in December 2020 to the company RBT – Construção, SA, is expected to be completed, as scheduled, by the end of 2022 and will result in the provision of 14 new housing units.

Climate Vulnerability Index applied to urban World Heritage Site for the first time

The results will be fed into Edinburgh World Heritage's CCRA project, supported by Atlas WH and the Place Based Climate Action Network, which will in turn inform Edinburgh's next management plan for the World Heritage Site.
